

THE SOBER CAT a guide to starting the dialogue on drug prevention.

Suggestion one

The books are short but the content is long. Feel free to break down the various segments. Bookmarks are provided on the website or from the author when buying a book in person.

Suggestion two

Ask your child to draw a picture of Paul with the Mama Cat and the three kittens. Ask why this was such a happy time for Jazmine and her siblings.

Suggestion three

Ask your child to draw a picture of candy and a picture of prescription pills. Drug dealers make drugs in the the shape of popular candy. They know that if they can attract children young then they have them hooked.

Suggestion four

Ask your child to draw a picture of Jazmine's new family: Mom, Dad, Samuel, Samantha, Grandmother, the dog and Jazmine. Ask why this was such a happy time for Jazmine.

Suggestion five

Ask your child to draw pictures of common household items that are used for huffing. Ask why these are dangerous if used in this fashion.

Suggestion six

Ask your child to draw a picture of a drug dealer and an addict. Hint: they can look like anybody.

Suggestion seven

If someone needs to take prescription drugs, ask you child where they should be kept in the house. Hint. Like guns these drugs can kill and should be kept under lock and key.
